"Challenges and Opportunities in Latin America"

Synopsis

By 2050, Latin America is projected to grow to 750 million inhabitants, with UN-Habitat projecting that 90% of these inhabitants will be living in cities. To cater to this trend of increasing urbanisation, investments in infrastructure in Latin America and the Caribbean have been gaining momentum in the past few years; for instance, Chile, Brazil, Peru, Mexico, and Colombia top the list of the most welcoming countries for PPPs in the region^[1]. Externally, Latin America countries have been cultivating relationships between the region and the rest of the world to facilitate trade and investment opportunities^[2]. This is seen by the recently signed Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP), the landmark deal signed between 12 participating nations, which will lower trade barriers and tariffs between Asia-Pacific and Latin American counterparts.

This Latin America Business Forum aims to bring together leaders of the region to share on the urban, water, and environmental challenges faced, as well as the upcoming trade opportunities available to address these issues. The forum will look at some of Latin America's largest economies: Brazil, Mexico and Colombia. The Mexican government's 2014-2018 National Infrastructure Plan will see public and private investments in infrastructure reach US\$590 billion, adding between 1.8 and 2 percentage points to Mexico's growth rates by 2018^[3]. The Brazilian government has announced a new list of planned infrastructure concessions worth US\$55 billion to be auctioned off to private sector companies. The Colombian government is aggressively pursuing investments in infrastructure and has announced a US\$70 billion infrastructure plan to 2035, including an ambitious Fourth Generation (4G) road infrastructure programme, the largest of its kind in Latin America^[4]. Business leaders familiar with this region will be sharing market trends, opportunities, their experiences and views on doing business in these countries and sectors.
