	The global population, currently at 7.3 billion, is projected to reach 8.5 billion in 2030 and further increase to 9.7 billion in 2050. A 2014 UN study forecast that 66% of the world's population would be urban by 2050. There will be a host of challenges like lack of access to clean water and sanitation, air pollution and lack of proper waste management.
